

In the Community's Strategic Plan 2018-2023, **youth empowerment** is one of the three cross-cutting themes that are mainstreamed across all activities undertaken by the Community as part of its mission to promote and strengthen democracy worldwide.

Democracy and Security Dialogue policy briefs and final report

The importance of youth empowerment as one of the factors of countering violent extremism was emphasized in the Democracy and Security Dialogue final report and policy briefs, commissioned by the CoD and developed by the researchers of the Brookings Institution and the Institute for Security Studies. The report found that countries with less youth participation in governance and a lack of youth empowerment programs have a high rate of their young population vulnerable with extremist ideologies.

Facilitating a continued discussion on the findings of the Democracy and Security Dialogue, the panel discussion focused on the challenges to youth engagement in the **peace and security dialogue** and showcased good practices for the youth participation, in the context of the UN Sustainable Development Goals. The event



also included capacity building workshop on effective actions for peace and security and development of action plans on non-violent conflict resolution. The workshop was also complemented by a **diplomatic skills training** for young leaders.
