The Community of Democracies (CoD) is an intergovernmental coalition of states dedicated to promoting and defending democracy worldwide. The CoD is comprised of Governing Council Member States committed to shared democratic values outlined in the Warsaw Declaration, adopted 25 years ago by over 100 nations from across the world.

# OUR HISTORY 25 years of bringing democratic governments together

The Community of Democracies was born as a common initiative of U.S. Secretary of State Madeleine Albright and Poland's Foreign Minister Bronislaw Geremek in the wake of political transitions around the world, to strengthen democracy through cooperation and mutual support. The CoD was established in 2000, where high-level delegations from over 100 countries gathered at the opening Ministerial Conference *Toward a Community of Democracies* and adopted the Community's founding document, the Warsaw Declaration.



The Community of Democracies is built on the commitment to shared democratic values enshrined in the Warsaw Declaration, which outlines the basic principles for a country to flourish as a democracy. The Warsaw Declaration provides a valuable roadmap to democracy for countries undergoing democratic transition and a checklist for already established democracies.

## **OUR MEMBER STATES**

The Community of Democracies is comprised of 30 Governing Council Member States representing different regions, different economic or cultural background, and different stages of democratic development.

The Governing Council provides a multi-stakeholder platform for dialogue and discussion to exchange experience, identify best practices on democracy-related issues and advocate on issues of common concern.





The Permanent Secretariat of the Community of Democracies, seated in Warsaw, provides administrative and operational support to the CoD structures and activities under the leadership of the **Secretary General Mantas Adomėnas**, elected in September 2024.

The 2025 Presidency of the Community of Democracies is held by its host country Poland.
